## Racism/Hate Experience Project – Kamloops and area

A community member has been subjected to racism/hate/discrimination.

I.e. someone has treated them badly, denied them a service or benefit, harassed or insulted them, abused their property, used threats or intimidation, used physical or verbal violence toward them, *in a way that targets the person's (real or perceived) race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, culture, etc.* This may even represent a hate crime or be grounds for a human rights complaint.

Who is disclosing?    The victim    A witness    A support worker/counsellor/service provider

When did the experience happen? (as best the client is able to communicate)

Where did this happen?    (name the specific place if the client chooses to do so)  
For example, a business, public area, bus/transit, workplace, office, etc.

Please describe the incident (as best possible, including what was said, who was involved)

Why was this person targeted? (what perceived characteristics were attacked?)  
(For example: race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, culture, language, etc.)

Would the client like assistance to pursue further action?

Such as making a complaint to a local business or organization, reporting a hate crime, looking in to or starting a human rights complaint, seeking legal assistance

### What constitutes a *Hate Crime*?

In Canada, a hate crime is defined as any criminal offense against a person, group or property that is motivated by hatred or prejudice towards an identifiable group.

*\*This means that the offensive action must constitute an actual crime to be considered a hate crime. However, there are criminal code categories for 'hate speech' and 'discriminatory speech'.*
